Wall-Badlands Area Chamber of Commerce Meeting Minutes March 11, 2019 Noon Luncheon Red Rock Restaurant

Wall-Badlands Area Chamber of Commerce Board President Jackie Kusser called the meeting to order. Dawn Hilgenkamp lead the Pledge of Allegiance.

Motion, by Anne Jo Spotted Bear with a second by Cindy Hauk, carried to approve meeting minutes from the February 11 Luncheon. Those in attendance reviewed the February Treasurer's Report and Jackie announced upcoming events.

Wall-Badlands Area Chamber of Commerce: Kelsey Clark: Thank you to all of the new and renewing Chamber members; the Chamber is looking forward to another great year! Kelsey provided follow up information regarding the two bills that were proposed to the state legislature, which would divert tourism promotion funds to horse racing within the state; neither of the bills are any longer under consideration. The 2019 Annual Meeting & Banquet of the Wall-Badlands Area Chamber will be held April 11, in the Wall Community Center Grand Hall; social hour will begin at 5 PM, dinner at 6 pm and the program at 7 pm. The board is excited to announce Helen Usera as the guest speaker for the event. In February, 40 visitor information packets were requested. A total of 115 information packets have been mailed year-to-date, which is down by 15 compared to last year. The Chamber website was down for roughly a week in the month of February which Kelsey feels is the reason for fewer information requests. The Chamber is continuing to work with Black Hills & Badlands Tourism Association to create a 2- or 3-day travel itinerary. The creation of the itinerary is an action step within the strategic plan of the Chamber in order to keep the traveling public in Wall for a longer period of time. Chamber member businesses can purchase a website link for their business within the itinerary for \$50. The itinerary will be on the Black Hills & Badlands website. The Chamber Tourism Committee is working to create a new community brochure. The brochure will be displayed at rest stops and businesses across South Dakota. The Chamber Retail Committee is expanding efforts to promote local shopping year-round.

Celebration Committee: Cheyenne McGriff: Thank you to everyone who attended the 'I Hate Winter' Party. All the tips earned at the party will be used to repair the Celebration picnic tables. The next Celebration Committee meeting will be March 12 at 7 PM at the Red Rock.

City of Wall: Mayor Marty Huether: Sales tax was up slightly for the month and the city is looking forward to a good year. The City Public Works Department has been working hard this year to keep the roads clear of snow and they are preparing for more snow. City snow warnings will now be announced on KOTA, KELOland, and social media to aid in informing community members to move vehicles off the road. The parking lot project is moving forward and the second pour of cement has been completed. Equalization for property taxes is coming up and local appeals are due at the end of the week. The city is working with Pennington County and the Wall School District to provide better police coverage at the school and in Wall. The Pennington County Commission has approved the funding for an additional officer in Wall to serve as the School Resource Office; the city and school have yet to approve. The officer will help provide coverage of the city during the summer.

Wall Economic Development: Liliya Stone: Jitterbug Daycare has been purchased and will hopefully be open this summer. Ginger Michael and Stacy Kitterman are planning a community Easter Egg Hunt and will be requesting donations from local businesses.

Wall Community Library: Helen Crawford (reporting for Jonny Winn-Holsether): The most requested adult book is *The Moon Sisters* by Lucinda Riley. This book has been talked about since last September; it finally came out this month and is in circulation this week. The *Seven Sisters Series* by Lucinda Riley, is the most checked out adult book. The library has 19 new adult books and new 1 DVD. The most requested children's books are Dr. Suess books because of Dr. Seuss's birthday, which the library celebrated! New release children's books are very popular; the library has 13 new children's books. Out of state visitors to the library this month have come from Colorado and Wyoming. Lacy attended a Jump Start Workshop and has great new ideas for the Summer Reading Program.

Badlands National Park: Mike Pflaum: Visitation was down 23% in February and down 18% year-to -date, however, the park is not concerned. Mike attended a round table discussion, hosted by South Dakota Department of Tourism, with Senator Mike Rounds. Overall, Mike felt it was a very good forum. Reminder: the Astronomy Festival will be held July 5-7; this is a big event for the park and they are hoping for clear skies and a large attendance.

Minuteman Missile NHS: Eric Leonard: Visitation for February is down with 279 visitors for the month, and a total of 309 visitors for the year. Visitation at the site depends greatly on weather conditions so they are hoping for a warm spring. March 1 was the start of same day ticket sales for the Delta-01 (missile control center) tour; same day tickets will be available now until the end of April. The site is excited to introduce virtual tours for not only Delta-01 but also Delta-09 (missile silo). A news release will be distributed soon.

Black Hills & Badlands Tourism: Hayli Johnson: BH&B is partnering with Workforce Diversity Network of the Black Hills to host a Lunch & Learn on Disabilities in the Workplace. The association is finishing up the Peak Season Co-op, which is a direct mail piece that will be sent to 17,000 households in Omaha and Minneapolis. The *Black Hills & Badlands Vacation Guide* is in production; if any business is interested in purchasing an ad, please contact the BH&B office as soon at possible. 2019 Black Hills & Badlands maps will be delivered to businesses soon.

Rodeo Booster Club: Mary Williams: Events that will be held at the Wall Rodeo Area in 2019 are: Wall High School Practice Rodeo, May 11; Wall Regional Rodeo, May 31- June 2; Pennington County 4-H Rodeo, June 22; Shrine Circus, June 28; Wall Celebration Rodeo, July 11-13; and Wall Crawl, August 10. Other notable rodeos Wall students will be attending are: the Junior High & High School Rodeo at the James Kjerstad Event Center, April 26-28; State High School Rodeo in Belle Fourche, June 12-15; National Junior High Rodeo in Huron, June 23-29; National High School Rodeo in Rock Springs, WY, July 14-20. Mary introduced Denise Baldwin who is establishing an independent insurance agency in Wall. Denise's office is located in the Wall Building Center.

Wall School District: Dan Baldwin: Milestones have been reached at the school this year with the Beef to School Program and a School Resource Officer. The school is thankful to the Badlands and BGNG for impact aid application support. Track and golf athletes will start practicing soon. Due to the impending snow storm, the school board will meet tomorrow rather than Wednesday and staff is planning/ snowplowing to prepare for more snow. Dan will be heading to Washington D.C. with Amy Bessett and will have the opportunity to meet with Dusty Johnson's representative, Darren Hedlund, who graduated from Wall High School in 2009. The NAFIS group will meet in DC this weekend.

West River Electric: Dawn Hilgenkamp: March 29-31, WREA will host a booth at the Home Show in Rapid City. Customers will be receiving a bill credit this month; WREA is giving a total of \$700,000 in credit to customers.
