CALL TO ORDER: Vice President Donna Curr opened the meeting at 12:00 pm with 24 people present. Pledge of Allegiance recited. Motion by Jackie Heathershaw, and seconded by Dick Johnson to approve the minutes of the October 19, 2015 meeting. Motion carried.

CITY OF WALL: Mayor Marty Huether reported on the Sales Tax. In 2014 tax received was \$1,009,174.00 and in 2015 it was up to \$1,064,597.00. On October 28th, a Black Hills area Mayor's meeting was held here in Wall. The towns that were represented were Edgemont, Hermosa, Spearfish, New Underwood, Newell, and Rapid City. Representatives from all three congressional offices along with Blasé Emerson also attended. It is renewal time for the Airport Engineering Services. Five firms have been invited to submit a proposal.

SCHOOL REPORT: Cooper Garnos reported that the Wall School District will be starting a Hall of Fame. The purpose shall be to recognize those men and women of the Wall community who have made outstanding contributions to the Wall School District. The board will be made of seven members (1) the current Wall School District principal or designee. (2) The current Wall School District activities director or designee. (3) Two current members of the Wall School District coaching or advising staff. (4) One member of the current school board. (5) Two long term community members. Eligibility consideration must have been out of high school for five years. There shall be no year qualifications for coaches/advisors, contributor's, media, etc. The Christmas program is scheduled for Mon., Dec 14th at 7pm (K-5) and Mon., Dec 21st at 7pm (6-12). **BADLANDS NATIONAL PARK:** Superintendent, Mike Pflaum introduced the facilities Manager, Ed Travis. The number for October this year were down 21%, but for the year they are up 12.9%. The park is looking for community input regarding the opportunity to move some of the buffalo over to the park area where more visitors can see them as well as creating more open range for the bison. The centennial of the park service is in 2016. The actual anniversary date is August 25, 2016.

FOREST SERVICE: Kurt Pindel mentioned that they will be doing an antique road show, where the public is asked to bring in arrowheads. Specialists from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln would identify the Native American tribe and type of arrowhead. Visitor Center hours of operation are now 8am-4pm, Monday thru Friday. The district office is completing the Cheyenne River Range Allotment Management Plan and the draft should be out in December or January.

MINUTE MAN MISSILE NHS: Eric Leonard let us know that the visitor center is now open seven days per week, year round. The winter hours remain 8am – 4pm. Since it is in the off-season they are only offering two tours of Delta-01 daily at 10am and 2pm, weather permitting. October visitation exceeded 5,000 visitors. This represents a 200% increase over last year. Exhibit installation is still not scheduled, but should occur in early 2016. The new park film is expected to be complete in the fall of 2016. The new Chief of Interpretation, Joe Brehm, will be arriving the week before Thanksgiving. He comes to us from the Castillo De San Marcos National Monument in Florida.

GOLDEN WEST: Greg Oleson wanted to thank everyone for their business. Golden West is excited about their Customer Appreciation Christmas campaign this year as it brings all the money back to the community. They will be giving gift cards made out to local businesses. You will receive more information in the mail or via internet beginning around the 16th of this month. FIRST INTERSTATE BANK: Janet Lurz reported the coat drive is still in swing, accepting new and slightly used hats and gloves. Also monetary donations are always helpful. There is no date set at this time, however First Interstate will be having a Customer Appreciation Open House soon.

CELEBRATION COMMITTEE: Wendy Allison let everyone know of the upcoming Annual Holiday Party. It will be held at the Wall Community Center in the Grand Hall on Sunday, December 13th from 1-3pm. Also at 1pm, a chili cook off (if they get enough entries). The children will enjoy a Santa's workshop this year with age appropriate items to make. Hayrack rides will also be available. This event is sponsored by the Celebration Committee and Black Hills Federal Credit Union.

RETAIL COMMITTEE: Jenny Patterson reported that we will have the Pancake Supper on Dec 9th from 5-7pm. Once again we will be giving away shoping sprees and gift certificates.

WREA: Dawn Hilgenkamp shared that West River has a Director position opening. They are starting member communication meetings. Dawn & Cheyenne attended the GOED in Pierre.

COUNTRY CUPBOARD: Carol Hoffman let us know that a \$10 donation may be given at Wall Food Center to be used towards a food basket to be given out at Thanksgiving. Items are then purchased to put together a dinner for those in need. They will be giving out 60 bags this year. The Lions Club will help distribute them on Nov. 21st. Christmas baskets will be needed as well.

WALL MALL: Carol also mentioned the Chamber meeting was held at the Wall Mall so that members could see how big it is, that they may consider leasing or using it for events. A craft show will take place on December 9th from Noon until 6pm, to coincide with the pancake supper and to get people in to town to shop local from area crafters and vendors. 1200 square feet has been donated by Joe Leach for a youth rec center upstairs. They are also donating the utilities to them and a pool table. They are working with the school to possibly get couches, chairs and items for them to use. Also possibly Golden West to get Wi-Fi for them. A possible kick off will be New Year's Eve. **RODEO BOOSTER CLUB:** Mary Williams informed us that the building they were working on at the rodeo grounds is now finished. The crow's nest is now tied down on cement and the bleachers as well. Bids are being taken for the SDRA and Regional Rodeos for next year.


