Disaster Awareness



Pennington County is vulnerable to many disasters including threats such as high winds & tornadoes, blizzards, heavy rain, light-hail or human caused threats such as terrorism, dam failure, wild-fires and spills of hazardous materials.

Get your entire family involved in the emergency planning process. Discuss why you need to prepare for disaster and the types of disasters most likely to occur in your home and in our geographic region.

Plan to share responsibilities and work together as a team.

Disaster preparedness planning can be educational, fun and lifesaving.

Learn

Familiarize yourself with the signs of events that come without warning and know the local advance alerts and warnings and how you will receive them. Learning what to do in different situations and developing and customizing your plans for the hazards we have in Pennington County and the specific needs of household members including animals will help you reduce the impact of disasters and may save lives and prevent injuries.

- Tune into local TV and radio stations following an alert message from the Emergency Alert System.
- Follow instructions from officials.
- Learn about your community's [disaster warning signals](#), what they sound like and what you should do when you hear them. (Siren tests occur on the 3rd Saturday of each month). Sirens can be set off for any type of disaster to warn people of an impending danger. Such as tornados, floods, or hazardous chemical spills.

[WEA's-Wireless Emergency Alerts](#): Wireless Emergency Alerts are messages sent to cell phones. They appear similar to a text message but they are not text messages. They are delivered via a different kind of technology to ensure they are delivered immediately and are not subjected to potential congestion (or delays) on wireless networks. The alerts have a special tone and vibration. You do not need to register for these alerts and your mobile phone will not be charged for receiving this message.

Build an Emergency Kit

Put together your own [disaster kit](#) or purchase a disaster kit. Either way, your disaster kit should contain essential supplies to see you through a minimum of three days. It should be checked and updated every six months.

Plan for Vulnerable Populations

Older Americans, senior parents, people with disabilities and children may have specific needs that need to be considered in your disaster plan.

Remember Your Pets

Because of health regulations, many shelters do not allow pets. [Prepare](#) now for the day when you and your pets may have to leave your home.

Through its Ready Campaign, the Federal Emergency Management Agency educates and empowers Americans to take some simple steps to prepare for and respond to potential emergencies, including natural disasters and terrorist attacks. **Ready asks individuals to do three key things: (1) get an emergency supply kit, (2) make a family emergency plan, and (3) be informed about the different types of emergencies that could occur and their appropriate responses.** All Americans should have some basic supplies on hand in order to survive for at least three days if an emergency occurs. Following is a listing of some basic items that every emergency supply kit should include. However, it is important that individuals review this list and consider where they live and the unique needs of their family in order to create an emergency supply kit that will meet these needs. Individuals should also consider having at least two emergency supply kits, one full kit at home and smaller portable kits in their workplace, vehicle or other places they spend time.

Emergency Supply List

A basic emergency supply kit could include the following recommended items:

- ⇒ Water, one gallon of water per person per day for at least three days, for drinking and sanitation
- ⇒ Food, at least a three-day supply of non-perishable food
- ⇒ Battery-powered or hand crank radio and a NOAA Weather Radio with tone alert and extra batteries for both
- ⇒ Flashlight and extra batteries ⇒ First aid kit ⇒ Whistle to signal for help
- ⇒ Dust mask to help filter contaminated air and plastic sheeting and duct tape to shelter-in-place
- ⇒ Moist towelettes, garbage bags and plastic ties for personal sanitation
- ⇒ Wrench or pliers to turn off utilities ⇒ Manual can opener for food ⇒ Local maps
- ⇒ Cell phone with chargers, inverter or solar charger
