Wall-Badlands Area Chamber of Commerce Meeting Minutes June 10, 2019 Noon Luncheon Wall Golf Course

Wall-Badlands Area Chamber of Commerce Board President Jackie Kusser called the meeting to order. Chamber member Jonny Winn-Holsether led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Motion to approve meeting minutes from the May 13 Luncheon, made by Dustin Curr with a second by Anne Jo Spotted Bear, carried. Those in attendance reviewed the May Treasurer's Report and Jackie announced upcoming events.

COMMUNITY EDUCATION OF THE BLACK HILLS: Tammy Sellars: Community Education of the Black Hills provides a wide variety of educational classes in the Black Hills and surrounding area. The organization has been providing classes in the Wall area for two years. Each year the organization hosts two sessions of classes: Fall and Winter/Spring. Last year approximately 120 instructors provided 200 affordable classes through the organization. Community Education of the Black Hills is fully funded by the tuition paid by students and donations made by sponsors. The wide variety of classes offered through the program are fit for all walks of life and encourage all to 'Live and Learn.' Anyone who is interested in teaching a class can contact Tammy.

WALL-BADLANDS AREA CHAMBER OF COMMERCE: Kelsey Clark: The Chamber began a digital marketing campaign which will run from May to August. Display ads have had 127,406 impressions and sent 656 visitors to the Chamber website. Search campaign ads have had 5,205 impressions and sent 577 people to the Chamber website. Since the campaign launch on May 16, these ads have accounted for 44% of traffic to the website and 14% of visitor information requests. Website sessions on wall-badlands.com were up 27% in May and are looking up for June. Last month 75 visitor information packets were requested and mailed out to potential visitors. The Wall City-Wide Yard Sales will be held Saturday, June 22, anyone interested in participating is asked to contact the Chamber office before June 13. Mark your calendars for the 2019 Wall Crawl on Saturday, August 10. The Wall Crawl committee is excited to offer a poker run through the Badlands, a Show & Shine Motorcycle and Car Show, food vendors and live band performances by Loose Change and John Riggins.

WALL CELEBRATION: Kelsey Clark reporting for Cheyenne McGriff: The 2019 Wall Celebration will be held July 11-13. This year's theme is "It's a bird, it's a plane, it's the 2019 Wall Celebration!" The 2019 event t-shirts are available for pre-order; orders must be turned in by June 17. The Celebration committee is looking for volunteers to help serve beer under the tent Friday and Saturday; if you are willing to volunteer please contact one of the committee members. The Celebration parade will be held at 10 AM Saturday, July 13. Parade information and registration forms can be found on Facebook or in the Chamber office.

CITY OF WALL: Marty Huether: Sales tax for the year is up compared to last year; BBB tax is down slightly. The Tesla charging stations in the newly completed parking lot have unofficially opened and already received good feedback from users. The Wall Fire Department will be hosting a fireworks display on July 3 at the Golf Course. The City Council once again provided funding for larger fireworks. Tomorrow there will be a meeting with Pennington County Law Enforcement to discuss theft cases and the rise of methamphetamine and opioid use in the area. The meeting will also include information about the school resource officer and the two additional deputies that will be in Wall full time; a total of 4 deputies. Marty will also meet with a representative who works with the commodity food program and Meals on Wheels. The City will hold a meeting with SD DOT to discuss the proposal for the City of Wall to take over South Boulevard.

WALL ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT: Marty Huether: Summer Nights Dance will have vendors and booths from different countries to allow attendees to try a food dish from each country. There will be a band from 7 PM to 1 AM. The lot at 402 Glenn St. had a previous county easement which prohibited the lot from being developed. The easement has been removed and they are hoping to have a developer begin work on the lot soon.

WALL COMMUNITY LIBRARY: Jonny Winn-Holsether: Unfortunately, Librarian Lacy Carson will be moving the end of June, therefore, the library board is looking for a new director. Applications can be picked up from the city office or the library.

BADLANDS NATIONAL PARK: Mike Pflaum: Traffic is picking up through the park. The Astronomy Festival will be held July 5-7; each year the festival shows great growth. The Cedar Pass Development Concept Plan was finalized this winter, the next step will be designing the new Cedar Pass facilities. The Badlands Conservancy will be holding an inaugural barn dance to raise awareness for the purpose of the group. The dance will be by invite only, please let Mike know if you would like an invitation.

MINUTEMAN MISSILE NHS: Eric Leonard: Rain has taken a toll on access road to delta sites and visitors can expect rough road conditions. Operations for the summer are proceeding as normal.

BLACK HILLS & BADLANDS TOURISM: Kelsey Clark reporting for Hayli Hull: BH&B has wrapped up the mass distribution of the Black Hills & Badlands Vacation Guide. The guide has a new design to keep visitors in the area, which will increase visitor trip duration and the taxable sales for our region. VIP cards have been sent out to all paid BH&B members. Members are encouraged to visit other businesses and cross-promote each other. The Wall Badlands 3-day itinerary has reached over 30,000 people on the Black Hills & Badlands Facebook page and had 5,246 pageviews in the first month it was on the Black Hills & Badlands website. The itinerary was sent to over 78,000 qualified subscribers and received an above average open rate. Other exciting campaigns for the Chamber that are running include mobile advertising, display banners and coming up are in-market and pre-planning exclusive co-op YouTube commercials with BH&B.

WALL RODEO BOOSTERS: Mary Williams: The Wall Regional High School Rodeo was held May 31, June 1 & June 2. Wall students performed very well and won high point. Business donations to the rodeo are providing awards for the athletes. There are 14 Wall Rodeo athletes who have qualified for the State High School Rodeo; the rodeo will be in Belle Fouche starting June 11. Celebration Rodeo performances will be held on July 11-13. This year the professional clown Jellybean will be offering a unique act at each performance. The rodeo booster club will be recognizing two individuals as Cowboy of the Year: Lavone Shearer and Larry Ruland. Playdays will start on July 16 and will be held for four weeks. The club is looking forward to hosting the Wall Crawl and Shrine Circus at the grounds this summer.

WALL SCHOOL DISTRICT: Dan Baldwin: The 2019 graduating class received over \$400,000 in scholarships in total. Both the girls' and boys' track teams won the team titles in the conference. The boys' team went on to win the second-place team title at the state meet. This season many students broke various records. Andrew Law won the 100-meter hurdles and 300-meter hurdles at the state meet. Andrew will attend a champion picnic in Pierre with Governor Noem. Wall was happy to finish out the school year with some of the highest academic ratings and lowest behavior referrals within the state.

GOLDEN WEST: Jody Bielmaier: Scams circulate through the area and Golden West does their best to notify the public of scams that may affect them.

WEST RIVER ELECTRIC: Dawn Hilgenkamp: As a fundraiser for Co-op families experiencing hardship, WREA hosted a golf tournament. There were 25 participating teams and it was felt the event was successful. WREA will be hosting a Chamber mixer in Rapid City to celebrate their 80-year anniversary.

FOUR RIVERS SHRINE: Joel Stephens: The Naja Shrine Circus will be in Wall on Friday, June 28. This year they will be offering 'Brunch with the Elephants' at 10 AM at the Rodeo Grounds; cinnamon rolls will be available for the public. The Circus performance will begin at 6 PM at the Rodeo Grounds. Tickets for the circus are \$10 for adults and \$5 for kids.
