Wall-Badlands Area Chamber of Commerce Meeting Minutes September 13, 2021 Noon Luncheon Wall Golf Course

Wall-Badlands Area Chamber of Commerce Board President Dustin Curr called the meeting to order at 12:05 PM and led the group in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Anne Jo Spotted Bear moved to approve meeting minutes from the July Chamber Luncheon. Second made by Lindsy Reagle. Motion carried. Kelli Ostenson moved to approve the Treasurer's Report. Second made by Anne Jo Spotted Bear. Motion carried. Dustin announced upcoming events in the Wall Community.

Wall-Badlands Area Chamber of Commerce: Kelsey Clark: The Chamber Retail Committee will be holding an Appreciation Supper on Friday, October 1, before the Wall Homecoming Football game. The supper will be held at the City Park; the committee will be serving hamburgers, chips, dessert and a drink as a way to show appreciation to community members for supporting Wall businesses by shopping locally. The Chamber is working on plans for a Fall Clean-Up Day as a result of public comments regarding litter in the community; more information about the event coming soon. The Chamber's video/photography project with Black Hills Video is wrapping up shooting and will soon start the editing process. The July Dashboard for the area is now available on the Chamber website.

Wall Economic Development: Liliya Stone: Five focus group meetings to discuss an Assisted Living were held with help from a facilitator; a sub-committee meeting will be held to discuss the summary from the focus groups. Legacy Child Care announced closure in July; WEDC has been working with the owner of the facility to keep the daycare open and help find staff. The city will be applying for a grant to create a walking path from the Kelly Addition to the school. The Healthy Hometown Committee had a walking audit of the community with representatives from Wellmark; a report of areas that need improvement for walking safety will be prepared and presented to the city council. WEDC is applying for a Workforce Marketing Campaign Grant from SD GOED; the campaign will target trade workers in Colorado and North Dakota. Two positions on the WEDC board are up for election and the current board members cannot re-run; petitions for the board are available in the WEDC office and must be turned in by October 19. Mary Williams gave an update on the Industrial Park and shared that after various discussions, the city received \$661,000 from the Pennington County Commission to help cover costs of the waste water system for the Industrial Park. Engineering plans for the Industrial Park are scheduled to be completed by the summer of 2022. Businesses interested in locating to the Wall Industrial Park are waiting on sewer system plans. Charon Geigle complemented WEDC on their accomplishments.

Black Hills & Badlands Tourism Association: Dustin Curr (reporting for Hayli Hull): Staff members from BH&B are unable to attend the Luncheon because they are attending a meeting regarding updates to the Badlands National Park Visitor Center. BH&B membership information has been sent out and are due October 1.

Fall Community Clean Up Day Friday, October 15 Wall Community Center 8:30 AM Due to concerns from community members regarding an increased amount of litter in our town, a Fall Community Clean-Up Day will be held on Friday, October 15. All local businesses, community organizations, and individuals are needed to help clean up our community! Hosted by the Wall-Badlands Area Chamber of Commerce

Rodeo Booster Club: Mary Williams: The PRCA Rodeo drew a big crowd and the big screen was a success. Thank you to the Chamber for supporting the event. Saturday night was a Spotlight for the South Dakota High School National Qualifiers; Lieutenant Governor Larry Rhoden was present and personally spoke with each student athlete. Of the 53 South Dakota High School National Qualifiers six of the students are from Wall. The Governor has invited the National HS Rodeo Team to the Governor's Mansion; thank you to WREA for sponsoring the HS Rodeo team. Wall had 28 athletes attend the State 4-H Rodeo; Wall students did well. A Little Britches Rodeo was held at the Wall Rodeo Arena and they gave good feedback about the facility. The Rodeo Boosters are embarking on ambitious rodeo grounds improvements by replacing the bucking chutes and crow's nest. The Annual Appreciation Steak Supper will be held October 16.

Wall School District: Dr. Pandi Pittman: Dr. Pittman introduced herself as the new Superintendent at the Wall School and noted it is good to be back in Wall. A strategic plan was approved at the September School Board Meeting and they will now be working to achieve all aspects of the plan. Strategic Plan goal areas are: Academics, Communication, and Facilities. The new High School Principal is Tracy Ragland. The approximate number of kids enrolled is 271; final enrollment will be determined at the end of September.

West River Electric: Dick Johnson: The WREA Annual Meeting will be held October 9 at the Wall Community Center; there will be no election for the Board of Directors but there will be an election for small bylaw changes. The Rapid City Member Appreciation Day will be September 24. Wall/New Underwood Football Game Tailgate will be October 15 before the football game in New Underwood. As a board member for Western Dakota Tech (WDT) Dick noted the school is now an independent school district. Enrollment for 2021 at WDT is flat compared to 2020. There is a need for trade workers. A nursing program through WDT is now offered in Philip. The Build Dakota Scholarship pays almost all of the tuition expenses for students as long as they work in the State of South Dakota for 3 years. Mary Williams noted WDT now offers a certification for meat processing.

Golden West: Kelsey Clark (reporting for Jody Bielmaier): The Golden West 69th Annual Meeting will be held at the School on September 25. Registration will begin at 8:30 AM and the meeting will be called to order at 10 AM. Voting will be held for proposed amendments to the Article of Incorporation and Bylaws as well as two director positions.

Wheelin' to Wall: Charon Geigle: The 5th Annual Wheelin' to Wall will be held September 25 & 26; 60 people are registered to-date covering 4 different states. Ronda Lee from KOTA is the official event meteorologist who will provide the event with weather forecast updates. A Pedal Parade of Lights will be held the evening of Saturday, September 25; glow sticks will be provided by BHFCU. A bicycle poker run will be held on Sunday, September 26. Charon shared the interest in bicycling has grown and she feels Wall has an untapped potential.

First Interstate Bank: Steven Edoff: Neighbors Feeding Neighbors will be held September 24 at the bank. With no other business, Liliya Stone moved to adjourn the meeting at 12:47 PM. Second made by Kelli Ostenson. Motion carried. The next Chamber Luncheon will be held Tuesday, October 12 at the Badlands Saloon & Grille.
