Tourism Industry partners from across the state gathered in Pierre for the 2022 South Dakota Governor's Conference on Tourism, January 18-20. The conference proved to once again be educational and inspiring with various sessions, including:

- TOURISM DAY AT THE CAPITAL/
   LEGISTLATIVE SESSION: Industry
   members gathered at the State
   Capital to visit with legislators about
   the importance of tourism and its vital
   contributions to our state. Conference
   attendees also thanked South Dakota
   Representatives and Senators for their
   support of the tourism industry.
- HOW TO STAY INSPIRED WHEN YOU ARE SO DARN TIRED: Times like these can make you feel

powerless and exhausted. Christine Cashen helped the audience spark new and innovative ideas, manage conflict, reduce stress, energize employees and create a happier, more productive workplace.

- SDT 2022 MARKETING PLANS: The Department of Tourism presented an in-depth look at the state's 2022 marketing efforts. Attendees learned about consumer insights and advanced data efforts that drive the departments strategy as well as opportunities to tie into the department's marketing efforts.
- KEY OPPORTUNITIES FOR TOURISM: During this session Paul Ouimet of NEXTFactor Enterprises Inc., presented results from the 2021 Futures Study and provided insight into key opportunities for destinations to recover, grow and flourish.
- THE COIVD RECESSION: PREPARING FOR THE BIGGEST WAVE OF CHANGE: By encouraging proactive thinking, Jeremy Gutsche addressed the geopolitical factors shaping our world today and encouraged attendees to identify the unseen potential for growth and innovation.

- **STATE INDUSTY UPDATE:** Partners from state government provided updates on their work and how it pertains to South Dakota's Tourism.
- VIA UPDATE: South Dakota Visitor Industry Alliance Lobbyist Justin Smith, discussed various bills moving through the SD Legislature and how they may affect the tourism industry.
- WORKFORCE INDUSTRY PANEL: There's no question workforce has been one—if not THE biggest, challenge of 2021. A panel of tourism industry members who faced this challenge head-on shared some of their creative and innovative solutions.
- **REACHING YOUR NEXT SUMMIT:** Attendees gained tools they can use to immediately develop a leadership mindset that engages, equips and inspires them and their team to step up and lead regardless of their title.
- TOURISM BRIEFING: It was another incredible year for the tourism industry as visitors flocked to the Great Faces & Great Places of South Dakota. Secretary of Tourism, Jim Hagen, highlighted the major accomplishments of 2021 as well what lies ahead for the industry in 2022. Hagen reported that in 2021 SD welcomed 13.5 million visitors; which is 26% more than the pervious year. Visitor spending reached \$4.4 billion; an increase of 30% over 2020, and a new all time record! The tourism industry supported 54,208 jobs in 2021; which created \$1.8 billion in direct income for travel and tourism supported jobs. 4.8 million people explored our National Parks; another milestone for the record book. In 2021 the tourism industry generated \$345 million in state and local tax revenue; saving each SD household \$980. Additionally, every dollar used to market SD generated \$41 in visitor spending and \$3 in tax revenue.

Cindy Hauk moved to approve meeting minutes from the November Chamber Luncheon. Second made by Lindsy Reagle. Motion carried. Rick Hustead moved to approve the Treasurer's Report. Second made by Ron Dinger. Motion carried. Dustin announced upcoming events in the Wall Community.

Wall-Badlands Area Chamber of Commerce: Kelsey Clark: The Chamber Holiday Sweepstakes concluded on January 3. The campaign gave away a total of \$2,000 in WALL BUCK\$ prizes for those who shopped local over the holiday season; a full list of prize winners can be found on the Chamber Facebook Page. The Chamber Retail Committee hosted the Pancake Supper, December 8, at Wall Drug. Thank you to all those who attended the supper, donated to Country Cupboard Food Pantry, and volunteered during the event. A special thank you to Wall Drug for again allowing the supper to be held in their café, supplying food and offering top-notch staff for the event. The Chamber Retail Committee was happy to give away a total of \$2,000 in prizes at the pancake supper. The Chamber hosted the second annual 'A Badlands Country Christmas' on December 15; thank you to all the event sponsors and those who attended the event. A new event the Chamber hosted during the holiday season was Christmas Crazy Days; Chamber Member retail businesses provided various specials/deals to promote local shopping. The Chamber once again hosted a Holiday Lighting Contest and gave away \$600 in WALL BUCK\$ as prizes; a list of winners can be found on the Chamber Facebook page. Friendly reminder to businesses; WALL BUCK\$ can be processed like a check but please do not to give cash back for the certificates. The Chamber continues to work on 2022 marketing. Kelsey will be out of the office January 18-20 attending the South Dakota Governor's Conference on Tourism.

**City Of Wall:** Rick Hustead: Plans with ECHO Valley are moving forward and the committee has been working with the engineer. The project is headed in a good direction and the City has reduced expenses for the project by more than one million dollars by doing septic systems for the housing lots. Mary Williams was able to secure \$661,000 from Pennington County to help cover infrastructure costs for the Industrial Park. The City received a grant of \$600,000 for repair on 4<sup>th</sup> Ave; the road needs improvement due to heavy truck traffic. The next Wall City Council meeting will be January 20 at 6:30 PM.

**Wall Economic Development:** Liliya Stone: Leadership classes will begin tonight and there are 15 people participating. A Workforce Marketing Campaign is beginning and will target potential employees in trade industries. WEDC is working on updating the housing study for the City of Wall. Businesses are reminded about the Worker Relocation Program that will reimburse workers up to \$750 per household.

**Black Hills and Badlands Tourism Association:** Hayli Hull: BH&B is kicking off the Travel Show Season at the Colorado RV, Adventure & Travel Show in Denver. The first pallet of 2022 SDVG will be distributed at this show. Looking forward to Tourism Conference.

Rodeo Booster Club: Mary Williams: The 20X Rodeo will be held the last Sunday in January, during the Black Hills Stock Show; there will be great representation from Wall High School rodeo athletes. The High School Rodeo Team will be holding various fund raisers to help cover entry fees; March 5 they will be hosting a gala in the Wall Community Center that will include a dinner, dance and auction. Plans have begun for the Pennington Co. 4-H Rodeo, which will be held the last Saturday in May. The Wall High School Practice Rodeo will also be held in May.

**Stompin' Grounds Coffee House:** Mary Williams: The coffee house will be doing a soft opening January 11 from 7 AM – 1 PM.

**West River Electric:** Dawn Hilgenkamp: Scholarships for high school seniors are now available and due January 17. Application for Operation Round Up are due February 1 and can be found online; this program provides funds to various non-profits and is administered by an independent Board of Directors.

**First Interstate Bank:** Steven Edoff: The 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual Festival of Trees was held on November 19. The program raised \$16,400 in net income for the Greater Wall Fund which helps fund projects in the Wall Community. Greater Wall Fund Scholarship applications are due by April 15.

**Ag Appreciation:** Steven Edoff: The 2022 Ag Appreciation will be held February 11 in the Wall Community Center. There will be no band at the event this year but prizes will be given.
